- → Gain authority to make legal decisions for your child.

- → Presumption of automatic custody in the event of loss of life of the other parent.
- → Ability to file for child support in the event of having full custody.

Policy Barriers in Georgia

It is no secret that policies and laws related to parenting have not served Georgia Dads with the best of intentions. One of the biggest policy barriers in the State of Georgia for non-married dads is the issue of Legitimation.

Fathers Incorporated believes that this is not only a critical issue for Georgia dads, but for our families and children as well.

How Do I Know If My Child is Not Legitimized?

If there is a legal marriage, there is a legal father and a legal mother, as well as an assumed biological father and a biological mother, to the child. If the parties have never gotten married, Georgia law presumes that there is not a legal father of the child. Even if you are the biological father of the child; without legitimation, you are not the legal father of the child.
